

# Volleyball Marathon - One More Time

On the first day of school, each of the four classes held a class meeting in the auditorium and was addressed by Mr. Becker, Mr. Middleton, and a few of the class officers. Mike Phelan, senior class president, addressed the seniors concerning class activities this year. Among the dances, car washes and prom was mentioned a volleyball marathon. Those students who attended Dover High last year remember last year's attempt. Mike proposed that we have another crack at it. He is, at present, volleying with the idea. (Huh-Huhl) We sent an interviewer to talk with him. Here is what he said:

INTERVIEWER: Mike, I've heard a rumor that the seniors are going to try to play volleyball again in a marathon. What can you tell me about this?

MIKE: O.K. Well, I haven't contacted anybody formally about it. What I've done is I've asked different seniors, members of the senior class, as sort of representatives of general feeling if they'd be interested and so far, the response to having another marathon, or to trying it anyway, has been good. I've got 100% response in the positive direction so I'd love to do it, if I can get the co-operation from enough kids, and I think with our class, seeing what we did last year, we can do it again, and do it right this time.

INTERVIEWER: Why are you trying this marathon again?

MIKE: Number one, to show people we're the kind of class that, well, you just can't keep us down. We'll get up and do it again. We lost last year. We'll go up and we'll try again this year because we're sincere. I feel sincere in the fact that we can get things done. Number two, with a world record comes prestige, and there's nothing I'd like to see more than Dover High's class of '76, the bicentennial

class, if you will, gain the prestige of setting a world record. Number three, I just think it'd be a lot of fun.

INTERVIEWER: How do you intend to organize the marathon and with who do you plan to work?

MIKE: We'll have, of course, Mrs. Lebo, who will be involved in the guidance of it as she was last year. I'm hoping for Mr. Plonski to be our special advisor. He did a great job last year and I'm hoping he'll do it again. All indications point to the fact that he would but I don't want to make any commitments, saying that he did commit himself. We'd probably go about it the same way we did last year. In this, I mean we would present it to Mr. Middleton, Mr. Becker, and then to the school board for approval. I'd like to make the planning go as smoothly as possible. We'd present it to the school board, then we'd go about the production of fund raising projects such as bake

sales, midnight bowling, car washes, et cetera, to cover any costs that might come up. New ideas would be appreciated too. Then, while all this is going on, we'd be checking into facts, statistics and technicalities of the actual breaking of the record, playing time and rules and regulations of the game. Finally, we'd check into the players. We'd go about making a suitable schedule. I think we could just about use last year's schedule really with little or no changes. It was probably about the best schedule we could find. Then we'd play in it. When we've got all the co-operation and the details taken care of, then Easter vacation rolls around, we'll be all set.

INTERVIEWER: What encouragement do you offer to those who, remembering last year, doubt the success of this marathon?

MIKE: I'd say we did everything. We covered every facet. We met up with difficulties at the last minute. So far in our planning this year, we've dis-

cussed how to overcome these problems and we think we've come upon two or three reasonable solutions to the final problem that we had last year.

INTERVIEWER: Do you have any last comments?

MIKE: I was really encouraged and heartened by the co-operation and the spirit we got last year among the members of the class of '76, and I just want to say, "Listen, I want to do it again, guys, and if you'll help, we can do it, man. Come out, give it one more try because we can really do it. We've got the spirit. All we've got to do is show that you can't keep us down. We're going to get up and with your help, we'll do it again, and do it right. Let's face it. Success is just getting up one more time than you've fallen down.

Mike Phelan would like to lead the senior class of '76 to a victorious year with a volleyball marathon. What do you think of the idea? See Mike any time at all and let him know what you think.

On Oct 21, I called Nancy Best and found that the Mall is available for our use on the condition that we provide evidence that we will be properly insured. Things are shaping up. The next step is to see what kind of money this will require (American! hah-hah). So I'll be talking to different insurance agencies soon.

Well, this morning we were informed that the entire teachers staff, (DEA) to protest lack of genuine consideration + concern for conditions + budgets by the Board of Education, refuses to participate in any <sup>or chaperone</sup> activities after school hours except those otherwise contracted. This means no dance, (\$200 in the hole) no ~~Midnight~~ Bowling, or any other fund raisers in the name of the senior class until a reconciliation is effected.

However, there are 3 ways of getting around these problems, two of which depend on co-operation from adults in this school, who have demonstrated, by last year's janitor conflict and the administration's carelessness in enforcing our having Dover custodians present until it was too late, that they are not dependable in any way. OVER

The three alternatives are as follows:

1. Seeing that 4 chaperones are required to be present at all fund raisers, our chaperones will be office administrators who, all but about 2 or 3 are not on "strike"
2. Have board members be chaperones.
3. JUST don't do things using school name or the school.


Nov 19 Marathon meeting
